Younger onset dementia discussion – Kate Henderson	 the younger onset key workers role is to act as a primary point of contact for a person with younger onset dementia, their carers and families to provide individualised information, support, counselling, advice and service planning. The Key worker will assist people with younger onset dementia to locate and link into service and support options appropriate to their individual needs. key worker to be available at any part of the client journey for people diagnosed under 65 years of age can have the carer as the client - does not have to be the person with dementia younger clients have different needs than older clients so trying to meet those needs and provide groups to support them younger onset specific days are being organised by various service providers in the north new program at Lonsdale to start soon regional across SA
