Danny McAteer, Director Roy Inglis, Senior Project Officer Adelaide Regional Team, Department of Health One of the recommendations of the Royal Commission into Aged Care Quality and Safety was to develop a local network of Department of Health aged care staff to focus on improving senior Australians' local experience of aged care services, and ensure that national planning and policy development is informed by an understanding of local issues and needs. An initial rollout phase of eight regional offices across the country has commenced, with one being established in the Adelaide region (graphically based upon the Adelaide Primary Health Network region).

The Department is interested to hear from providers regarding what are the major issues facing the broader aged care system in the Adelaide region – this could be from the viewpoint of consumers and/or providers.

Otherwise, feedback can be given to SSRG Project Officer to forward on to ART.

Discussion regarding some of the issues arising include (in no particular order):

- If someone is on a Level 3 Package and they require a Level 4 Package ACAT will not come out to re-assess unless the person has spent these funds. There are issues around putting people at risk and the red tape that goes along with it.
- Responsiveness of providers restricted by red tape.
- There are consumers are on the system through 'informed fear' rather than 'informed decision'. Meaning people are scared they won't have access to services they require when they need them, and accept services that they potentially do not need.
- Misinformation and misunderstanding of the system.
- The system in complicated.
- Better flexibility of the system is required.
- Not enough staff.
- Issues around recruiting staff/workforce, such as the right fit, loss of potential workforce through initial stages of recruitment and months from commencement of employment, etc.
- Consumer centric but not consumer directive. i.e. cleaning or personal care offered between a window of 9am-12pm.
- Do not turn Aged Care into NDIS.

	The name "aged care" – this should be called something else for community/CHSP.  Meeting with the DoH Adelaide Regional Team and the other metro Collaborative Projects in December to discuss further.
