	The Aged Rights Advocacy Service (ARAS) offers a free, confidential and state-wide service to older people, or their representatives, who are:
	living in residential aged care
	<ul> <li>receiving Commonwealth Home Support Programme (CHSP) or Home Care</li> </ul>
	Package (HCP) services

	at risk of, or experiencing abuse from family or friends
	<ul> <li>living in a retirement village.</li> </ul>
	ARAS also has specialist Aboriginal Advocates who provide culturally safe support and host an annual Intergenerational Elders and Youth Gathering in regional South Australia.
	Currently, ARAS is participating in the Aged Care System Navigator Trial, which supports older people in navigating the aged care system and accessing services.
	ARAS provides advocacy assistance to support older people to uphold their rights and their responsibilities.
	ARAS Community Care advocacy can assist the older person or their nominated representative if they use or are eligible for the Commonwealth Home Support Program (CHSP) or Home Care Package (HCP) services. An advocate can help them:
	<ul> <li>Get started – establish their agreement and care plan</li> <li>Negotiate fees that they may be asked to pay</li> <li>Review their agreement and care plan</li> <li>Raise issues of concern or present complaints</li> </ul>
	ARAS can support the older person to be in control of their care services, to speak up about care concerns, and to uphold their rights; to have a voice and a choice.
